

# Get Out & Cover Up!

Summer has arrived at last and with it, hopefully, some warm weather. Sunshine provides us with Vitamin D, which is absorbed through the skin and benefits our bones and teeth as well as providing protection against many diseases. We would recommend your child wear a sun cream SPF of at least 30 to protect their skin against damaging UVA and UVB rays. Once protected, we believe that the benefits of playing outside are multifaceted. Using climbing frames, slides, cars and general running about develops gross motor skills. Cognitive development also gets a good workout, as children use their imaginations in game play and also to think up new games and rules. Their social and emotional wellbeing, as well as linguistic skills also are supported by interactions with other children, learning how to take turns, having patience and playing fairly and with kindness towards each other.

## From The Pantry – Summer Applebugs

For once kids can play with their food!

#### Ingredients

2 red apples 1/4 cup raisins 1 tablespoon peanut butter

8 thin pretzel sticks

- 1. Slice apples in half from top to bottom and scoop out the cores using a knife or melon baller. If you have an apple corer, core them first, then slice. Place each apple half flat side down on a small plate.
- 2. Dab peanut butter on to the back of the 'lady bug', then stick raisins onto the dabs for spots. Use this method to make eyes too. Stick one end of each pretzel stick into a raisin, then press the other end into the apples to make antennae.
